While reading only two books is required, **please read as much and as often as you possible can!** Good readers are good writers and good writers are good readers! Please keep track of all the additional books you read this summer on the attached reading logs. I cannot wait to see how much you have read! Please **do not include the two books you are using for the reports on the log.** You may make copies of the log if needed or just copy the format and create your own reading log. The reading log should be handed in on the first day of school, **please note due dates for the two reports and follow them.** **Please enjoy the books you read and have fun with the projects. Lose yourself in the adventures on the pages, make new friends, visit new places, and enjoy the journey that only comes from reading a good book!**

Your child's *Lexie Score Range* is cited at the bottom of the *Reading Report* along with several book suggestions. Many book stores and libraries use these reading ranges to best organize books.

Please save **ALL of your written work**, even brainstorming notes, graphic organizers and rough drafts. Everything you write is part of the Writing Process which we will review over and over during the coming year. Every part of the process is important and should be saved.

Please have fun with the reports you are asked to complete. Please review the instructions for each genre: fiction and biography. Please follow the directions, and if you have any questions, or anything is unclear, please do not hesitate to ask for help or clarification. Asking a classmate is not as productive as asking the person assigning the task-so **PLEASE ASK ME!**

Here is a list of other questions/skills to focus on this summer in an enjoyable way and on your travels:

Religion- When we are at Mass can I identify the main parts of the liturgy? From what part of the Bible are the readings? Do I praise God each day for the blessing in my life? Do my actions reflect my love of God and neighbor? What is my favorite Scripture story?

Social Studies- Where are we going? How are we getting there? In which direction are we traveling? How have transportation improvements helped/hurt societies? Why do we have leisure time? What historical events have happened where we are?

Science- How does this move? What is energy? How does my body move, and stretch and stand? Why do we need sleep? Is sunlight good? What kind of bug is that?!

Language Arts- Do I speak and write in complete sentences? Can I identify common nouns and proper nouns, action verbs and verbs of being, adjectives, adverbs, and prepositions? Can I identify the subject, verb, direct object, or subject complement in a sentence? Can I diagram that sentence?

Complete the attached Biography Book Report Graphic Organizer

Use the organizer to write a paragraph- (5+) sentences- about the subject (person) of the biography.

Be prepared to come to school as the person about whom you have read.

You are to dress as the person and present a brief synopsis-summary- of the person's life.

You must be prepared to speak for at least one minute, but no more than three minutes.

You may bring any props or visual aids that will help you to "get into character."

For example, if your subject worked with animals, you could bring in a stuffed animal.

You may use your graphic organizer and paragraph to make note cards, but you should not read directly from them.

Please be creative! You will not be graded on your ability to put together the perfect costume, but to convey an understanding of the person. Please try not purchase any new materials- reusing and recycling what you already have are perfect.
